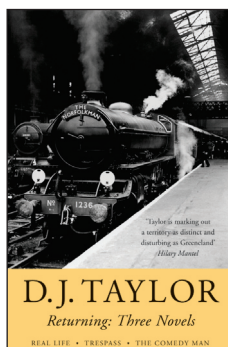

A trilogy of Whitbread prize-winner D. J. Taylor's three acclaimed novels *Real Life*, *Trespass* and *The Comedy Man*

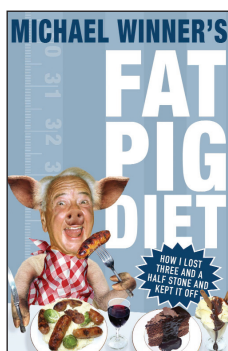

I was on holiday in Spain with Judi Dench and her husband Michael Williams. During supper in Puerto Banns, Judi slipped away from my table and returned with a present for me.

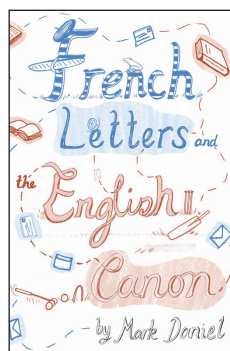
